

Board of Directors Meeting January 17, 1976 10:00 AM

The meeting of the Board was called to order at 10:15AM with all members present. Guests attending were Dennis Bicknell, Wilf Howarth, John Easley, and Bill Babcock.

Ernie opened the meeting by reviewing the Articles of Incorporation (rules for the annual meeting). Meeting procedures were reviewed and proxys were divided among board members unless specifically assigned. No board member may have more than 30% of the proxys. Mike Harris distributed the annual treasurer's report and briefly reviewed it with the board members.

E.P.L. Foreclosure Update

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John Easley presented a proposal to the board from Mr. Maitland that would clear the land, provide power, &deed the common areas to the RLA. The proposal would not provide for tennis courts and stables. The lawyers intend to recommend acceptance of the Maitland proposal at the annual meeting. The RLA will need to meet Maitland's bid of \$ 680,000. We can use all the assets of EPL to meet the amount due. In order to secure power a cash contribution will be needed from landowners foreclosed on. If we go to trial the case may not be resolved for several years, whereas this proposal can be settled in a couple months. Discussion followed John Easley's report, with many questions from the board.

Approval of Minutes From Previous Meeting

Ernie Conrad inserted a correction into the minutes that the new board members will not take office immediately, but within thirty days. Bill Rosenberg moved to approve the minutes with the above correction. Dave Hedlund seconded. Motion carried.

Bills

Marti Hedlund submitted a bill for her quarterly salary of \$62.50. Ernie submitted a bill for \$48.00 expenses. Both bills were approved.

Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 AM. The next board meeting will be Sunday February 1, 1976, at Mike Harris' cabin in The Retreat at 12:00 pm.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

February 1, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 12:25 PM. All members were present. Marrin Conrad, guest, arrived later.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ernie Conrad announced that an accident occurred by the Retreat front entrance last week. Also, the Forest Service has opened the Trailhead to public cutting.

SECRETARY REPORT

Marti Hedlund announced her resignation at the end of the third quarter, which is April 1, 1976. This should give more than adequate time for the president to find a replacement. Marti will be resuming her pursuit of career interests this Spring, so is no longer available.

Dave Hedlund motioned that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved. Wilf Howarth seconded. Motion carried.

TREASURER REPORT

Mike Harris reported that the treasury is virtually unchanged since the annual meeting. \$ 1500 has been received to date this year. New assessments paid account for \$ 1200, past due assessments equal \$ 102.63, and \$ 272 was received for annual meeting dinners. Mike will send letters for past due assessments. Mike would like to entertain the idea of attaching a late fee. Discussion occurred.

Mike motioned to approve the special assessment to settle the foreclosure suit when it is submitted by John Easley for payment on the common area. Joe Jackson seconded. Motion carried. Wilf Howarth motioned to approve the treasurer's report as read. Joe Jackson seconded. Motion carried.

ROAD MAINTENANCE

No money has been spent on snow removal yet this year, reports Wilf, so there may be more money for improvements. The procedure for repairing signs was then discussed. Dave Hedlund felt posts could be secured from Smith's saw mill at a reasonable price. It was decided to obtain the speed limit signs from the county and post 20mph instead of 15mph. Ernie felt a 15T load limit sign should be placed by the bridge.

BEETLE CONTROL

Dave Hedlund, chairperson, reported that the beetle trees will be flagged by his committee when the trees first turn. Cutting should be delayed as long as possible so that the cutting crew is sure to get all the trees. He felt that the second week in June is the appropriate time for marking trees, and cutting and spraying in the first two weeks in July. Dave will contract a wood company, as he is not available to do it himself.

Discussion occurred on beetle control. Ernie wanted the trees marked earlier. Discussion also occurred about cutting trees next to power lines. Ernie suggested cutting power line trees under Road Maintenance. More discussion. Dave will have more precise recommendations at the next meeting.

Wilf Howarth was selected as co-signer on checks written by the R.L.A. His signature will replace Lloyd Angell's. Ernie Conrad then read the duties of the officers from the book of by-laws.

NEWSLETTER COMMITTEE

Ernie Conrad reported that Marrin Conrad is newsletter chairperson and Marg Hjelmstad will assist her. The newsletter will
be sent out May 15. Two will be sent this year. \$ 500 is in the
budget, not including postage. Discussion occurred about different topics of interest for the newsletter. Many suggestions
were made. Marrin will present a list of newsletter headings at
the next meeting.

SUMMER MEETING DISCUSSION

Ernie Conrad reported that the summer meeting will be a "bring your own everything" barbeque. The date of August 14th, 1976 was established by the board. Ernie suggested having the meeting from 11:00 - 1:00PM and the barbeque from 1:00 - 3:00. Ernie will try to secure the town hall in GlenHaven, but will also ask cabin owners if they are interested in providing the meeting place.

LEGAL DISCUSSION

John Easley was not present for a legal discussion. Ernie reported that the people affected by the foreclosure have received letters from John Easley regarding Maitland's proposal.

A.C.C. REPORT

Dennis was not present to give a report.

BILLS

Marti Hedlund submitted an expense bill for expenses from October to January for \$ 147.42. Mike Harris submitted an expense bill for \$ 21.30. Bills were approved.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 3:00PM. The next meeting will be Sunday, March 28, 1976 at noon at Mike Harris' cabin in The Retreat.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

March 28, 1976

The mesting was called to order at I2:20 PM. All members were present except for Wilf Howarth.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ernie Conrad reported that there had been a fire on lots I and 2 filing 2 of the Retreat which also burned 25 acres of forest land. There was a letter from Dr. Bennett, owner of lots I and 2, filing 2, thanking all who helped to fight the fire on his land.

The summer meeting is tentatively set for August I4 at IO AM. It will be held at the Glen Haven Town Hall which requires a \$15 donation.

A gift was presented to Marti Hedlund upon her resignation as Corresponding Secretary. She was thanked for a job well done.

MEWSL TTER

Marrin Conrad reported that the format for the newsletter has been completed. It will contain stories of interest and reports from all committee heads. The newsletter committee will handle the mailing.

SECRETARY REPORT

Marcella Bicknell will be the new Corressponding Secretary replacing Marti Hedlund who has resigned. Ernie Conrad reviewed the minutes of the previous meeting. Mike Harris moved that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved. Joe Jackson seconded. Motion carried.

BEETLE CONTROL

Dave Hedlund reported that I65 beetle diseased trees have been marked with red paint; also I5 trees in the power lines will be marked with yellow paint. These I5 will be cut and treated under Road Maintainance. Wood cutting contractors are expected to submit bids for the cutting and treating of affected trees. Ernie will send a letter concerning beetle control to all landowners with affected trees on their property.

Seedling trees for planting, along with plant food tablets, have been ordered from the Longmont Soil Conservation Service. These include Ponderosa Pine, Blue Spruce; and Douglas Fir. Planting is recommended during April and May. Dave Hedlund is to buy IOO pounds of grass seed for planting.

ROAD MAINTAINANCE

Wilf Howarth was ill. Ernie Conrad reported that the roads have been plowed twice. Wilf is to replace damaged signs and poles, also paint all the signs and supervise the removal of the I5 trees in the power lines. This work can be done well within the budget.

TREASURER REPORT

Mike Harris submitted the treasurers report showing a cash balance of \$7,315.78. Assessment for I976 have been paid by 47 landowners. Uncollected assessments in the amount of \$500.43 for years I975 and before for I7 landowners were listed by the treasurer. Dave Hedlund moved to approve the treasurer's report. Joe Jackson seconded. Motion Approved.

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The books have been submitted for audit to a Boulder C.P.A. who will also prepare Form 990. The President signed a form for an annual report. A new bank signature card was prepared, a copy is attached to these minutes. The treasurer will mail reminders April Ist that unpaid I976 assessments were due April Ist and become delinquent May Ist.

COMMON AREAS DISCUSSION

Ernie Conrad is trying to get the common areas deeded to the RLA and it will be necessary to redeem the I974 taxes of \$93.26. Three of the common areas have never been assessed. The remaining common areas are assessed at \$2100. The I975 taxes are \$158; the I976 taxes are estimated at \$250. Ernie will try to get the assessed values reduced. A discussion on title insurance for the common areas indicated it would cost about \$50. Mike moved to disperse funds as necessary to pay taxes on the common areas. Dave Hedlund seconded. Motion carried.

RLA LIABILITY INSURANCE REPORT

Joe Jackson reported that he has made inquiries of insurance companies into obtaining liability insurance for the RLA. This insurance would cover the RLA, board members and committee heads in the event of a law suit. The Allstate Insurance Co. estimates a cost of \$500. An unnamed co. would like to see a copy of the RLA by-laws before submitting an estimate. Ernie read Article II of the by-laws. It was decided that bids must be submitted to see if the budget would allow this expense. A straw vote was taken with the result that Joe Jackson pursue the matter.

LEGAL REPORT

John Easley was not present. Ernie said that the legal action on foreclosures should be finalized on March 29. Maitland will receive the vacant lots and undeveloped land (not part of the Retreat). The power situation is uncertain. Extra money will be used to bring in power as far as possible. John Easley will submit a written report when it is completed.

BILLS

Ernie Conrad submitted an expense bill for \$55.48. Mike Harris submitted an expense bill for \$20.12. Joe Jackson submitted an expense bill for \$33.43. Marti Hedlund was paid \$62.50 for services as corresponding secretary from January through March. Bills were approved.

A.C.C. REPORT

Dennis Bicknell reported that an A.C.C. meeting was held. Two building applications and one driveway application have been approved.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned ay 2:45PM. The next meeting will be held on Saturday, Mar I5, I976 at 4:00PM at the home of Ernie Conrad in Estes Park.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

May 15, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 4:20pm. Alb members were present except Dave Hedlund.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ernie Conrad gave an outline of interesting and relative material from a booklet called HOMEOWNER AND THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION. He asked all members to read the booklet to see if the RLA should buy copies for all landowners at 65¢ a copy or just take relative information from the booklet to send to the landowners.

The deed for the commom areas has been secured and recorded with the county. The deed is from Escape Properties to the RLA. The assessed values of the common arears have been reduced from \$3500 in 1975 to \$1150 for 1976. The back taxes have been paid and all tax records sent to Mike Harris. The deed and assessed valuation letter will be kept in the minutes record book.

Secretary Report

Marcella Bicknell gave a summary of the minutes from the last meeting. Mike Harris moved to approve the minutes. Ernie Conrad seconded. Minutes were approved.

Beetle Control and Landscape Maintainance

Dave Hedlund was not present. Ernie reported that 240 seedling trees have been planted in the Retreat, also 60-70 pounds of the 100 pounds of grass seed purchased has been spread.

Invitation to bid on 1976 beetle control was sent to 9 bidders. Invitation was prepared with forest service help. A copy of the invitation to bid, which details the procedure to follow, is attached to these minutes. Ernie Conrad, a forest service man and Wilf Howarth will observe the work while in progress.

Bids were received from three bidders and opened by Ernie Conrad. The bids were as follows; Rich Flowers, \$11 per tree or \$1683 total; Skip Peck, \$7 per tree or \$1071 total, Troy Allen, \$1.50 per tree or \$229.50 total. A discussion on the bids followed. The cut wood will not be stored in The Retreat. Copper Hill Ct. and lot 13, filing 5 will be cleared of lasr year's cut wood. Mike Harris moved to award the beetle control program to Troy Allen at the rate of \$1.50 per tree or \$229.50 total. Wilf Howarth seconded. The motion was approved. It was agreed to pay Allen in two installments. One on June 27 of \$129.50 and the balance upon completion of the contract.

LEGAL REPORT

John Easley reported that the foreclosure has been settled, the stipulations signed and formal dismissal will be in the near future. Also, the MLC deed of trusr has been released. A contract has been signed in the name of the RLA for installation of power at a set price of \$78,000. Power installation should begin by the end of May. Cutting of trees for the installation of power will cost \$1000. There are no provisions for removal of cut trees as yet. Ernie read the report of the foreclosure from the format of the newsletter. John Easley thought it was well done. Mike asked if the RLA can use lien rights to collect delinguent assessments. Easley said that the RLA has no lien rights.

TREASURER'S REPORT

TREASURER'S REPORT



Mike Harris submitted a treasurer's report showing a cash balance of \$8,780.71. Cash disbursements for the period of 3/27/76 to 5/14/76 amounted to \$840.07. Expenditures for the year 1976 to date amounted to \$2,340.05. Assessments for 1976 have been paid by 104 landowners. The audit of the books has been completed. One mistake regarding the 1974 IRS form 990 was found; it was corrected by filing an amended form 990 for 1974. The amended form and the form 990 for 1975 will be mailed today. The assessed value by audit of the RLA was \$7653. A slight error was found in the figures presented at the annual meeting. This error was due to a mistake in addition. It will be corrected. It was suggested that some of the RLA money be put into a savings account. This action would need a board resolution. Mike will look further into this matter. The report was approved.

NEWSLETTER

Marrin Conrad reported that the newsletter is ready to be printed. She showed the format to the board members. It was decided to use first calss mail for the newsletter. Wilf Howarth moved that the newsletter be approved and sent for printing. Joe Jackson seconded. Motion was approved.

ROAD MAINTAINANCE

Wilf Howarth reported that we have experienced a mild winter and to date \$425 of the budgeted \$2000 has been used for snow removal. He pointed out that there is still a possibility of snow in May or early June. Griffith Contractors has been contacted for the spring maintaimance. Other spring maintainance will include; 2 new culverts, repainting signs, putting up new signs and replacing any damaged sign poles. The removal of dangerous trees along the roads and power lines (including green beetle trees) has been done. Ernie reported a culvert with a hole in it on Miller Fork Rd. between Hedlund's and Bicknell's property. The report was approved.

RLA LIABILITY INSURANCE

Joe Jackson reported the the Duran Excess Underwriters, Inc. estimates the cost of liability insurance for the RLA at \$500. This estimate is the same as that received from Allstate. The application from the Duran Excess Underwriters, Inc. will be returned for a firm bid. Several other possibilities will be investigated by John Easley and Mike Harris.

ACC

Dennis Bicknell reported that there has been one cabin approval given since the last meeting and one pending.

MEW BUSINESS

The summer meeting will be held on August 14,1976 at 10am at the Glen Haven Town Hall. There will be a Board of Directors meeting at 8:30am on the same date.

It is anticipated that there will be approximately 60 inaccessible trees. Joe Jackson made a motion that the RLA pay \$3 per tree for treatment of inaccessible trees. Wilf Howarth seconded. The motiom was approved. A letter stating that \$\mathbb{T}\$ Troy Allen is the authorized tree cutter for the Retreat has been sent to the Sheriff and the district Forester, also one has been given to Mr. Allen to identify himself to any landowners. A letter explaining the beetle control program has been sent to affected landowners. There was a discussion on the pros and cons of having the Miller Fork Creek stocked by the state. Joe Jackson made a motiom that Ernie, as president of the RLA, contact the Division of Wildlife and negotiate a contract between the RLA and the state of Colorado to have the Miller Fork Creek stocked for one year. Dave Hedlund seconded. The motion was passed.

ROAD MAINTAINANCE

Wilf Howarth reported that there have been no changes in road maintainance since the last meeting. It was decided tha Wilf can hire some help in putting up signs if necessary. Ernie reported that the bridge at the entrance has been sprayed with penta chlorophenol by the Forest Service. He suggests that the RLA consider replacing the wheel boards on the bridge. There was a discussion on the danger of the narrow approach at the entrance of the Retreat. Ernie suggested posting a warning sign. Joe Jackson suggested looking into the possibility of moving the road to the east-at the burned out cabin- at some future date.

INSURANCE REPORT

The possibility of using general liability was investigated and found to be inadequate for this type of coverage. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

August 14, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 am. All members were present.

SECRETARY REPORT

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

TREASURER REPORT

Mike Harris reported that the RLA has a total of \$9,369.22.

BEETLE CONTROL

Ernie Conrad reported that all diseased trees have been cut and sprayed.

ROADS

Ernie reported on the condition of the roads following the flood of July 31. Dunraven Glade, Streamside Drive and Black Creek Raod sustained heavy damage. Biser Excavation has been authorized to make emergency use roads through Streamside Dr. and Duhraven Glade at a cost of approximately \$3000. A representative of the Job Corps accompanied the board members on a tour of the damaged area. The Job Corps will give an estimate on the number of man hours necessary to repair the damage. The Job Corps supplies the man hours but the RLA must supply the materials. Many new culverts will be needed, especially a 6 foot culvert for the rear entrance and an 8 foot culvert for the main entrance. It may be possible to obtain these two culverts from the county at no charge. The original forms for a Federal Grant have been completed in an effort to obtain financial aide in repairing the damage, and several other sources of financial aide are being investigated.

A discussion of the work that Ernie Conrad has done in The Retreat in the aftermath of the flood was held. With the additional work necessary to rehabilitate The Retreat, it was decided to bring Ernie Conrad's situation up for discussion at the special summer meeting.

The Larimer County assessor indicated that the 1976 property taxes will be reduced in general and probably further reductions to flood damaged property.

LIABILITY INSURANCE

Insurance was obtained from The Hawkeye-Security Insurance Co. for \$500,000 Liability coverage and \$100,000 property damage at a cost of \$121.00 per year. The address of the company follows. Frontier Agency, Inc. 8250 Smith Rd.

The policy went into effect on June 29, 1976.

The estimated cost of this michinery is \$150 to \$300 per hour for a time period of approximately 6 weeks. A second checking account will be established to handle the funds for flood repair. Landowners with flood damage can apply for a grant or loan from The FDAA in Loveland. Secondary homes ar eligible for thes aide. The Army Corps of Engineers will remove debris from private lots if a Right of Entry Agreement is signed.

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING September 19, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 11 AM. All members were present except Wilf Howarth.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ernie announced that the road blocks into the area will continue until October 15. The Elk hunting season will be from Oct. 30 to Nov. 6. Ernie is now divorced and must sell his lot in the Retreat for the divorce settlement. Mike Harris explained that the by-laws state that board members must be landowners.

Waster Belz reported that the Whitney's of lot 6 filing 2 have complained about the logs stacked in the cul-de-sac near their caban. The members examined the map in order to find another area for these logs. They could find no other alternative but to leave the logs in their present location.

SECRETARY REPORT

Mike Harris meved that the minutes of the previous board meeting be accepted. Joe Jackson seconded. The minutes were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mike Harris reviewed a written treasurer's report which is attached to these minutes. The \$50 assessments are coming in slowly but steadily. Ernie suggested Hike keep the funds used for flood repair in a separate category on his treasurer's report. Mike agreed to correct this in the report for the minuted. Mike announced that the RLA will not have to pay a penalty to the IRS. The treasurer's report was approved. Ernie reported that due to the flood the tax assessments on the common areas have been reduced by about 30%. The RLA has received notice of this reduction on 6 of the 7 common areas.

FLOOD REPORT

Ernie reported that the RLA flood repair project comes under the Lagimer County Project. Ernie sent a letter concerning funds for road reconstruction, to the Larimer County agent on Sept. 17, 1976. The FDAA estimaters met with Ernie on Aug. 24. The areas in need of repair or reconstruction were broken down into 9 areas. These 9 areas were toured by the estimaters. A Damage Survey Report was completed for each area. The estimate was done on a cubic yard basis. The number of yards completed each day must be recorded on time cards. An Estimated Cost of Proposed Work form was completed. The estimated cost given by the estimaters for repairing and rebuilding the roads in the Retreat was \$52,858. The RLA should get 75% of the estimated cost within 2 to 3 weeks and the remaining 25% after the roads are rebuilt and inspected and the books are audited. The federal agent suggested that the RLA may have to pay this 25% of costs before being reimbursed by the government. It is still not definitely positive that the RLA will receive aide from the gevernment. The agent wants to see a court decree of 1965 concerning the Retreat roads being public. The Corps of Engineers agreed to include Streamside Drive to the Junction of Black Creek in their debris removal program. They have repaired the raod to some extent while removing debris.

The RLA is paying the contractors at work in the Retreat on an hourly basis. These contractors have their heavy machinery at work at present and have completed approximately 1/3 of the Black Creek road. As of Sept. 16 the RLA owes the contractors \$6829. The trongst Service has shown interest in repairing Dunraven Glade, however, they would want to wait until spring to do the nenessary repairs. If the repairs are done by the Forest Service it is not

known if the FDAA would lower the DSR. This could include the main entrance bridge which is estimated at a cost of approximately \$11,000.

Walter Maitland has requested that the RLA include continuing Black Creek road another ½ to 1/3 mile to Toynton's camp on it's Federal Aide application. This extra distance would include abuot 60 acres of Mr. Maitland's land. Ernie mentioned this request to the agent who turned it down on the basis that the extra distance is not in the Retreat and therefore have no connection with the RLA. The agent suggested that Ernie have Mr. Maitland and Mr. Toynton contact him.

Ernie explained that the audit of the books after the road work is completed is very important. He suggested that the RLA set up a new bank account to handle the funds for flood repair. Mike Harris resolved that the RLA set up a Special RLA Flood Repair Account at the First National Bank of Estes Park to be used exclusively for the repair and reconstruction of the flood damaged roads in the Retreat. Joe Jackson seconded. The resolution was accepted. An amount of \$2,873.31 was transfered from the general account to the Flood Repair Account until the gevernment funds are received. A signature card for the new account was completed. A Reqest for the Advance of Funds form was sent to the Larimer County Local Agent at the suggestion of Mr. Rapier, the federal agent.

BEETLE CONTROL

Ernie reported that several people have offered to help with beetle control but no one wishes to be the chairman. Ernie has a complete beetle control file which includes; master map. letter to landowners, invitation to bid, government bid sheet, recommended spray, etc. He would be willing to help anyone who might be interested in being the chairman of this committee. The beetle control program should get under way in January or February of 1977. This will be started by marking the diseased trees. This will give a rough idea of the extent of beetle damage. When this is determined the REa will ask for bids. Walter Belz consented to take the beetle control file home with him and study it thoroughly.

NEWSLETTER

Marg Hjelmstad will be the chairperson for the newsletter committee. She hopes to have a newsletter completed and mailed to the land-owners by January 1977. Much of the newsletter will be devoted to the flood of July 31 and its affect on the Retreat. Also included will be committee reports, special interest articles and original works of the children of the Retreat.

BILLS

Ernie Conrad - \$96.68, Expenses incurred; Marcella Bicknell - \$100.18, expenses incurred; Marcella Bicknell - \$62.50 secretarial salary; Estes Park Hardware - \$156.45 grass seed; Mike Harris \$30.79 expenses incurred. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

November 21, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 11:20 AM. All members and Bill Babcock, RLA attorney, were present. Jim Beal, owner of lot 17 filing 2, was present.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ernie Conrad, RLA president, announced that the Elk Hunting Season for area 20 which includes the area around the Retreat will be from Dec. 11-21. Ernie is looking into the possibility of having the Miller Fork Creek stocked by the state next summer. Structures in the Retreat now have numbers. This numbering system is being done by the Postal Service. The number on each structure indicates the distance in miles of that structure from the county road. Beavers have built a dam on the Miller Fork Creek. They will be left alone until spring.

SECRETARY REPORT

There were no additions or corrections to the minutes of the previous meeting. The minutes were accepted.

FEGOD REPAIR REPORT

Ernie reviewed the status of road repair from the minutes of the previous meeting. He also reviewed two completed Damage Survey Reports. One report was for funds used from the RLA general account for emergency flood relief. The other DSR was for a permanent estimate of the entire Retreat. The estimate given by the Federal Government was \$52.858.

The Forest Service is going to repair Dumraven Glade, because of this \$13,853 was deleted from the original estimate of \$52,858. The repair work on Dunraven Glade will be done by the contractor whose bid is accepted by the Forest Service. They are expected to begin repair work in April,1977. Also the Forest Service has drained the pond on lot 9 filing 3, which is owned by Mr. & Mrs. James Persichetti, because of improper drainage into Dunraven Glade.

At present the roads in the Retreat are 90% completed. The roads have been graded and are in good condition. There is some finishing work to be done which includes; cleaning culverts and ditches two culverts to be put in, a piece of culvert to be added to the large culvert which runs under Streamside Dr., surveying, and reseeding. The surveyors will be in the Retreat on Nov. 29 to set the rights of way on Black Creek Road and Streamside Dr.

As of Nov.9 1976 \$33,563.97 has been paid toward flood repair. The accounts due as of Nov. 21 1976 total \$16,921.05. Projected additional expenses total \$11,800. The entire job of flood repair will cost approximately \$63,000. Funds received from the government at this time total \$26,550. Funds ordered but not received at this time to replace those used from the RLA general account for emergency flood relief total \$4004.50. Mr. Rapier, the federal agent, has assured Ernie that after the agents have inspected the work done and the amount of money required to do that work the RLA should get the total amount. If the RLA does not receive the additional funds from the government a loan may have to be obtained.

Verra Construction Co. has been hired for $2\frac{1}{2}$ weeks to do the final grading and end work. The road banks have been sloped for reseeding. The government agents have stated that the RLA can repair it's roads only. Damage to individual lots must be repaired by the individual landowners.

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Questions:

Joe Jackson asked if the RLA can ask for contributions in the event of inadequate funds. Ernie answered that that is a possibility.

Mike Harris suggested obtaining a loan to pay the contractors in the event that the government does not furnish full funds for repairs. Mike then asked Ernie if he feels that we have a well documented case for receiving additional funds. Ernie answered yes. All the papers are in order, all accounts and time cards have been accurately kept. Mike then asked about the power on Black Creek road. Ernie answered that it is installed to Carroll's house. There is still no power on Fisherman's Lane. Power into the fourth and fifth filings should be started again in the spring. The funds for this power was paid to the Estes Park Light and Power Co. Bill Babcock said that the RLA shouldn't get hurt on the funds already paid for this power.

Jim Beal, landowner, was present to discuss his Retreat property, lot 17 filing 2. This lot is located on Black Creek Road just beyond the gate leading to Toynton's camp. Mr. Beal is concerned with the following: The Black Creek is now across the road from his lot. He feels that this decreases the value of his lot. He feels that approximately 100 cubic yards of fill dirt was removed from his property. He feels that the restored road is on his property. He feels that the road repairing removed trees from his property. He particularly wants the stream restored to it's original path.

Ernie replied that after the damage survey it was decided to eliminate the two culvert crossings at that location. The culvert required was 60 feet at \$16 per foot. Ernie acknowledged that some fill dirt may have been taken, if so it could be replaced if Mr. Beal desires. Ernie explained that it was hard to determine if live trees were removed. Ernie explained that on Mr. Beal's property the road and stream rights of way arelin the same boundaries and he feels that the road is in the right of way.

Mr. Belz suggested having the area surveyed to determine the boundaries. Mr. Beal agreed. The surveyors will be in the Retreat on Nov. 29. Mr. Beal then left the meeting.

Mr. Babcock reviewed the legal aspects of this problem. He suggested that the surveyors make a plat plan of the road and stream before the flood and ofter restoration.

Mike Harris asked Ernie if there were any other potential problem areas similar to that of Mr. Beal. Ernie answered that he was not aware of any other problem areas.

It was explained that another month of supervision is necessary to complete the job of flood repair. Joe Jackson made a resolution to authorize another \$1000 for Ernie Conrad for supervision and consulting and coordinating work necessary to continue the flood repair work. Wilf Howarth seconded. The resolution was approved. Ernie said that he might have to hire a secretary for a few days to help with paper work.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mike Harris submitted a written treasurer's report which is attached to these minutes. The \$50 assessments are still coming in slow-ly. Mike will send another notice to those still owing the \$50 assessment.

BEETLE CONTROL
